Resolutions

For those of you new to the WI, just a brief explanation of the Resolutions that we need to vote for this month (Jackie will be sending out a reminder of their details in an email before the meeting)

Every year the membership votes for a 'cause' out of a selection that has been nominated by members (anyone can propose a resolution but there is a specific process to follow). Someone will come up with an idea that matters to them that they believe the WI can get behind and do something about (a famous one being 'Keep Britain Tidy'). Last year's was to do something about cleaning up our rivers. They then investigate and come up with a proposal. NFWI organise a committee to discuss and whittle down to a reasonable number – this year there are 4.

The idea is that we can get behind the resolution by hopefully doing something practical and by lobbying local and national Government and any organisations that may be involved.

Every full member can vote at the meeting for the Resolution that they think is the most important (not at your dual WI) and that they think we can influence. The votes are collected and then sent to our Federation Office (in Hatfield Peverel) who then collect all the votes from all their WIs and forward them to our National Federation office in London. All votes are then counted. The 'winner' is taken to the National Annual Meeting (this year at the Albert Hall) where it will be debated and delegates representing all WIs will vote as to whether we will take it forward and campaign on it. It is not a given that we will go ahead. There have been occasions when it has been felt that the arguments for the Resolution haven't been compelling enough.

Voting slips will be provided on Monday. Let me know if you have any questions about the process.
